Vaccine Descriptions:

HepB: protects against hepatitis B

DTaP: a combined vaccine that protects against diphtheria, tetanus, and pertussis (whooping cough)

Hib: protects against *Haemophilus influenzae* Type b

PCV: protects against pneumococcal disease

Polio: protects against polio, the vaccine is also known as IPV

RV: protects against infections caused by the Rotavirus

Influenza: protects against influenza (flu)

MMR: protects against measles, mumps, and rubella (German measles)

Varicella: protects against varicella, also known as chickenpox

HepA: protects against hepatitis A



Children 4-6 years of age are required to have a 5th dose of DTaP, 4th dose of Polio, 2nd dose of MMR prior to school entry. Administrative Rules of Montana (ARM) 16.28.702

Children 4-6 years of age are recommended to have a 2nd dose of Varicella.
