Sheriff McQuillan meets with Commissioners regarding Gallatin County Detention being at capacity; discussion
10/26/2015 regarding the impact to operations due to prisoner transports
11/17/2015 Tour Rosebud County detention facility in Forsyth and Custer County detention facility in Miles City
12/10/2015 Commissioners approve Agreement with Rosebud County for Inmate Detention (\$60/day)
\$19,500 invoice from Gallatin County for February inmate housing costs; look at Broadwater County as
3/21/2019 another housing option; begin discussions about exploring building a facility.
